#### I. Introduction.

- A. Text: Mark 16:14-20.
- B. Christ never promises that God would win the whole world or that the church would change the whole world.
- C. However, it is the wrong attitude to rest in this attitude. There is a difference between winning the whole world and evangelizing the whole world.
- D. The church lacks motivation to go. Only the Spirit can generate this.
- E. There are three incentives for world evangelization.

## II. The Lord commands it.

- A. Jesus serves in the book of Mark. (Mark 10:45, Isaiah 53)
- B. One of the problems with the church is that we do not recognize the Lordship of Jesus Christ.
- C. The Lord commanded us to go--this is our commission.
- D. We have an obligation to the world--where we are at and where we are not at.

#### III. The world needs it.

- A. Mark is saying through baptism that people are lost without the gospel.
- B. The gospel is suited for all the world, and all the world needs it. (John 3:16)
- C. If all the church had the conviction that the world was condemned to hell, they would do much more evangelism.

### IV. The church can do it.

- A. The disciples of Jesus were audacious enough to believe that they could actually evangelize the world.
- B. The church takes too much in and puts too little out.
- C. The church is afraid to step out in faith and do something.
- V. Jesus says that his work is not done, which initiates the church's work.
