 - C. The results of obedience. Obedience is the measure and basis of our love. (Ecclesiastes 12:13-
 - 14; Deuteronomy 10:12-13; Jeremiah 29:11; Ephesians 1:8; Micah 6:8; John 14:21; Deuteronomy 5:21)
 - D. To know God is to please him. (Genesis 5:21-24; Hebrews 11:5)
 - E. We get know God through conversion. (John 3:16)
 - F. We get know God through his Word. (John 5:39)
 - G. We get to know God by spending time with him.
 - H. We get to know God through the example of godly people.

III. We should love God.

- A. Jesus commanded it. (Matthew 22:34)
- B. Loving is an act of the will. (Deuteronomy 30:19-10)
- C. God is a jealous God. We are to fear God and serve him alone. (Exodus 34:14; 1 Corinthians
- 4:7; Hebrews 12:15; Luke 12:15; Jeremiah 45:5)
- D. We show our love through obedience and wanting to be with him. (John 14:15)
- E. We show our love for God in our love for others. (Matthew 25)
