- A. The mission of the disciple is to preach, encourage and serve others. (1 John 4:17; Psalm 78:71-71)
- B. The balanced Christian life is illustrated by a wheel.
 - 1. The rim is our life which touches the world.
 - 2. The center of the wheel is the hub, which carries all the weight and driving power. This is Jesus Christ.
 - 3. The spokes include: the Word of God, prayer, witness, fellowship. (Luke 18:1-8; Proverbs 27:17; Ecclesiastes 4:9; Matthew 18:19-20)

 - a. Believe God can do anything. (Philippians 4:13)
 - b. Have a positive outlook. (Philippians 4:8; Titus 1:15; Proverbs 15:15)
 - c. An expectant attitude. (Hosea 10:12)
 - 2. Spoke 2: strong drive. (Psalm 18:29)
 - a. A clear objective. (Matthew 28:19-20)

- b. Faith in the face of difficulty. (Job 23:10)
- c. Enthusiasm. (Proverbs 15:30)
- 3. Spoke 3: steady persistence.
 - a. Seeing the invisible. (Hebrews 11:27; 2 Corinthians 4:18)
 - b. Believing the incredible. (Romans 4:20-21)
 - c. Attempting the impossible. (Joshua 3:14-17; Luke 5:4-6)
 - d. Patience. (Hebrews 10:36; Psalm 37:34)
 - e. Time. (Deuteronomy 7:22; Isaiah 28:9-10)
 - f. Steadfastness. (1 Corinthians 16:13; Ephesians 6:13-14)
 - g. Panic proof. (Isaiah 8:12-13)
 - 1) Know God is sovereign.

- 4. Spoke 4: mature personality.
 - a. This comes through a knowledge of Jesus. (Ephesians 4:13)
