D. Is reconciliation. (Ephesians 2:16; Colossians 1:20)
E. Is sacrifice and death. The cross costs us our lives. (Luke 9:23-24; John 12:24; Hebrews 10:19-20; 1 John 3:1)
F. Is hope.
