SEMINARY INVOLVEMENT

Midwestern - Six years ago, I was asked by <u>Midwestern Seminary</u> to design their collegiate ministry program. We hold classes to train collegiate ministers during the J-term (1 intensive week) in January and May. Universities are not in session. We are able to bring in outstanding people to teach such as Harold Bullock, John Hawkins, Waylon Moore, Bob Anderson, Brett Yohn, Bobby Pruett, John Strappazon, Johnny Pons, Jeff Jimerson, Kevin Richardson, Neil Walker, Lawson Lau (working with internationals) Mike Story, Kevin Difelice (Navigator specialist in fund raising), and David Geisler (apologetics). The MDiv program has gone so well that we were asked to design a DMin plan of study.

Southwestern - This past spring, I was approached to go on faculty at <u>Southwestern Seminary</u> in Fort Worth to be a professor in the E. F. Hallock Chair of Student Work. The classes here are also designed for January and May. At this point, we are non-resident, staying in Norman. I am being asked to speak in some classes on Scripture memory and disciplemaking. The first class in May was attended by 23, not all of whom are planning on collegiate ministry, but some take the class as an elective. Harold Bullock and Neil Walker and I taught that class. God is opening a wide door for working with potential leadership for colleges and universities where we have no work. Please pray that He will call more and more into this needy area of our society. It is exciting to see the openness at our seminaries these days to "whatever works."

COLORADO

When the Colorado State Director retired, I was asked by the six directors and state office to lead that work. They have very little financial resources for student ministry and are designated by the <u>Southern Baptist</u> <u>Convention</u> as a "pioneer area or emerging region." Therefore, all but the man at the Air Force Academy raise their own support.

We have workers at Boulder, Gunnison, Greeley, Ft. Collins, Denver, Grand Junction, and Colorado Springs and a couple from Midwestern Seminary will go to Pueblo in April. We desperately need more help in Denver and really on all the other campuses in the state. I led their fall retreat and we had 77 students and workers attend. Please pray for additional workers for this state.

MY DISSERTATION

Having a doctorate is important for seminaries for their accreditation needs. Therefore, I hope to finish the DM in Collegiate Ministry by May, 2006. The program I designed and will write my dissertation on is "Trying to Develop University Students Into Life-long Disciplemakers." This will require many hours in the months ahead. Prayer is appreciated.

THE STATE OF THE OU BCM

I couldn't be more pleased with what is happening at <u>OU</u> and the leadership there. John Kelsey and crew continue to do an excellent job. God is really blessing there. Also, the Oklahoma BSU's in the state are in very capable hands with the addition of John Strappazon. John was on our staff many years ago and prior to returning to OK was directing one of the largest church collegiate ministries at First Baptist Church, Lubbock. We are excited about the future of OK BSU's (most now being called BCM's - Baptist Collegiate Ministries).

The biography is titled Max Barnett -- College Minister and Disciplemaker and will be available at the retirement / reunion weekend. The following is the foreward of the biography written by Kirk Humphreys.

In all of our lives, certain events and people are pivotal. The direction of our life is changed forever by an occasion or comment that, at the moment, might not seem important. But when viewed looking back over a lifetime, those life-changing people and events become clear.

For me, and thousands of other college students over the past five decades, an encounter with Max Barnett has been life changing. I came to the University of Oklahoma in the fall of 1968, shortly after Max had arrived on campus. Over the next several years it became clear to me that, although I knew a lot about Jesus Christ, I had never surrendered my life to Him as my Lord and Savior. Through the ministry of Max and the example of a BSU staffer, I came to a life-changing point of decision while on a BSU spring break retreat at Glen Eyrie in Colorado Springs.

Max and Sandra kept investing in our lives even after I left the university, married Danna, and launched into a career. Over the next several years we enjoyed many times of fellowship and encouragement, where Max and Sandra brought young couples like us in contact with outstanding Christian leaders who taught us principles upon which to build our young marriages and families.

Over my lifetime I have had many opportunities to share my faith and exercise leadership as a believer. The first steps were taken with Max Barnett - it was at his side that I knocked on my first dorm room door to share my faith and led my first Bible study.

In this book, my good friend, Mike Thompson, has captured the real Max Barnett - his character, faithfulness, heart and vision. It's like a friend once told me, "Telling is not teaching; listening is not learning. You learn to do by doing." That's Max Barnett - friend, mentor, disciplemaker, and doer.
